Dear Friends,

We Episcopalians celebrate Easter not just on Easter Day but for the whole 50-day season of Easter, which concludes with the Day of Pentecost. In our Sunday worship during Eastertide, we begin and end each service with "Alleluia!" For

50 days we proclaim that "the Lord is risen indeed!"

But all Christian churches do not accord Easter 50 days of observance on their church calendars. In fact, less than half of the many Christian denominations in America have anything resembling a church calendar at all. With the possible exception of Christmas Day and Easter Day, some churches make no note of saints' days, holy days, feast days—no season of Advent, no Lent, no Epiphany.

This fact doesn't necessarily mean that we're right and they're wrong, but it does point out that people and cultures and institutions have varying ways of measuring time and marking its high points.

In the Bible, time is the arena in which God's revelation takes place. Each event in its sacred story reveals some aspect of God's plan, from the liberation of God's people to the call for justice

from God's prophets to the birth, ministry, death and resurrection of our Lord. All of this happened in real time, as empires rose and fell.

Many have remarked that the older you get the quicker time seems to pass. Our birthdays seem to slip by at an accelerating pace. When we were children, the wait for Christmas seemed interminable. But people my age start to feel that they have barely put the tree ornaments away when it is time to fetch them again.

So it has been with my 39 years here at Trinity Church. My last Sunday is now less than two months away. I can't believe that it's almost time to say goodbye.

I'll save the goodbyes for June. But as the days dwindle down to a precious few, I can't help taking note of what a gift it has been to serve this parish for so many years, to make so many good friends and to be inspired by your faith and commitment to God and to Trinity.

And so I would like to treat the remaining time of my ministry here as an extended season of Thanksgiving—a little over 50 days. One day in November is not long enough for me to thank our Lord for all of his abundant blessings. Nor is it long enough for me to thank you for being the amazing people of Trinity Church.

## Vestry Highlights

**Treasurer's Report:** Heather Alexopoulos, Treasurer, handed out and explained her report. She noted that everyone should try to stay within their budgets. Heather went on to say that she is still in negotiation about funding the construction costs. On motion made and seconded, the Treasurer's Report was approved.

It was suggested that the weekly E-News should have a notice about donating memorial flowers.

**Properties Committee Report:** Duo Dickinson reported on his construction handout. He detailed the 5 funding sources for the Columbarium; Elevator; New Bathrooms; Undercroft and water lines; Window work, Organ, Rooflets, Balance of Undercroft and Elevator work. Duo also explained the cash flow needed by Chapel Construction Co. He went on to detail the other projects; Additional cost for Rooflets; Window removal/Cleaning/Surround Repair;

additional Organ repair and protection. Next, Duo distributed and discussed a preliminary construction schedule.

**Columbarium Committee:** Barbara Fennelly reported that, now that the columbarium is about to be built, a letter is being formulated that will be sent to all those who subscribed, detailing ways of paying their subscription.

Jan Tredwell asked how do we keep our regular members during the construction? After discussion, it was suggested that perhaps each Vestry member could be assigned a section of the Parish List to try to keep tabs and see if those people are still regularly attending.

**Interim Update:** Joe Dzeda explained about the problems with determining the compensation for the proposed Interim Rector. Discussion about the compensation followed.

## The Still Small Voice moves to Email as Primary Method for Delivery



The default method for sending our monthly newsletter will now be email for those who have email addresses. The Executive Committee recommended this to the Vestry, and they approved this method as an effort to reduce costs. Trinity spends approximately **\$1,617** on postage each year to mail the Still Small

Voice. If you would still prefer to receive the Still Small Voice via U.S. mail, you must notify the Parish Office by **June 1** or you will receive the Still Small Voice via email.

Trinity will also utilize email as its primary tool for communication and avoid using postal mail as much as possible. We apologize for any inconvenience.

Andy and Polly have both touched our lives in ways they may never know.

It is fitting that we begin to say our farewell in the context of worship. The evening will begin with a very special Evensong at which all four choirs will sing. The Right Reverend Andrew D. Smith, *Bishop of Connecticut* and seminary classmate of Andy, will preach at the Evensong.

Following the Evensong, we will gather at the Omni Hotel for a Banquet featuring a Roast and Toast of Andy and Polly Fiddler. Many people are working hard to make sure this is a special evening.

The cost of the banquet is \$75 per person. We realize this may be financially difficult for some people. The goal was

to make the party totally self-sustaining and not to take any money out of Trinity's already strained budget. The amount absorbs the entire cost of the party including babysitting, music, dinner and a surprise gift for Andy and Polly. Extra contributions towards a purse for Andy and Polly are appreciated, but totally optional.

The ticket price also includes a small amount of extra to cover unexpected costs and to assist a scholarship fund. 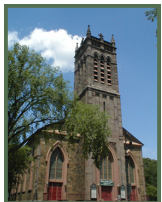
## Choir Recognition Sundays and Summer Choir

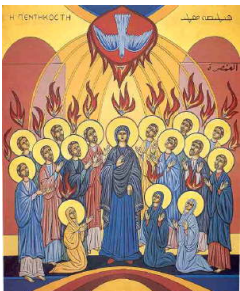

## Wear Red for Pentecost



Pentecost is translated "the fiftieth day," and is one of the most important feasts in the Christian calendar. Pentecost comes fifty days after Easter Day and is the tenth day after Ascension Thursday. This year Pentecost is **May 31**.

This Feast is historically and symbolically related to the Jewish harvest festival of Shavuot or the day,

fifty days after the Exodus, on which God gave the Ten Commandments at Mount Sinai to Moses.

It is also known as the birth of the Church because we believe it is the day when the Holy Spirit came to the Apostles and other followers of Jesus as described in the Book of Acts, Chapter 2. During this story, tongues of flames rested on the followers' heads and gave them the ability to speak the language of the people they met. Pentecost is a reminder that God overcomes our own diversity, and Christ welcomes and calls all of us into fellowship with one another.

Pentecost is also called Whitsunday, especially in the United Kingdom and other parts of the Anglican Communion. It is one of the few times in the year where the clergy's vestments and church hangings are red. The color red often symbolizes the Holy Spirit. It reminds us of the tongues of flame that rested on the heads of the Apostles. Following Pentecost, the Church enters "Ordinary Time," in which the clergy wear green vestments until Advent.

Parishioners are invited and encouraged to wear red to remind us of the Holy Spirit and the special significance of this day.

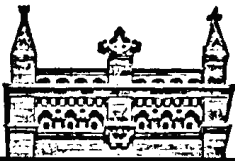
